

ON THE ROAD TO DAMASCUS!

In Acts 9 we see Saul of Tarsus on the Road to Damascus to find more Christians to persecute. On the way, Jesus appears to him and tells him to go to Damascus and there he would receive further instructions on what he needed to do. Saul became a believer when Jesus spoke to him according to Acts 9:6. Many people believe that Saul was saved at that point in time, but is this really the case? If Saul was saved when he said, ***“Lord, what wilt thou have me to do?”*** then consider the instructions that he was given by Ananias three days later. Ananias told Saul to ***“Arise, and be baptized, and wash away thy sins, calling on the name of the Lord,”*** (Acts 22:16) If Saul was saved on the road to Damascus, then he was saved before he was baptized, and before his sins were washed away, and before he ever called on the name of the Lord. He may have become a believer when Jesus spoke to him on the road to Damascus, but he wasn't saved until he called upon the name of the Lord by arising and being baptized to wash away his sins! This is the Bible truth about Saul's conversion to Christ.
